

E Neonatology **Inequalities** in Health and their Effect on the Newborn

DR KATHRYN JOHNSON

Consultant Neonatologist, Leeds General Infirmary

- Inequalities in health start before a baby is born with potential adverse effects on the pregnancy affecting the newborn even prior to birth
- Rates of prematurity and congenital abnormality (two of the commonest causes of neonatal death) are affected by inequality and deprivation
- These adverse affects are then seen throughout childhood
- Increased rates of adverse neonatal outcomes in these group perhaps results in a greater number of medical negligence claims from such groups
