- Review of Khan v Meadows [2021] UKSC 21 on scope of duty. The link between breach of duty and the type of loss claimed (the SAAMCO test)
- How to apply breach of duty knowledge to your cases
- A review of recent developments in causation and material contribution, the courts approach to divisible and indivisible injuries
